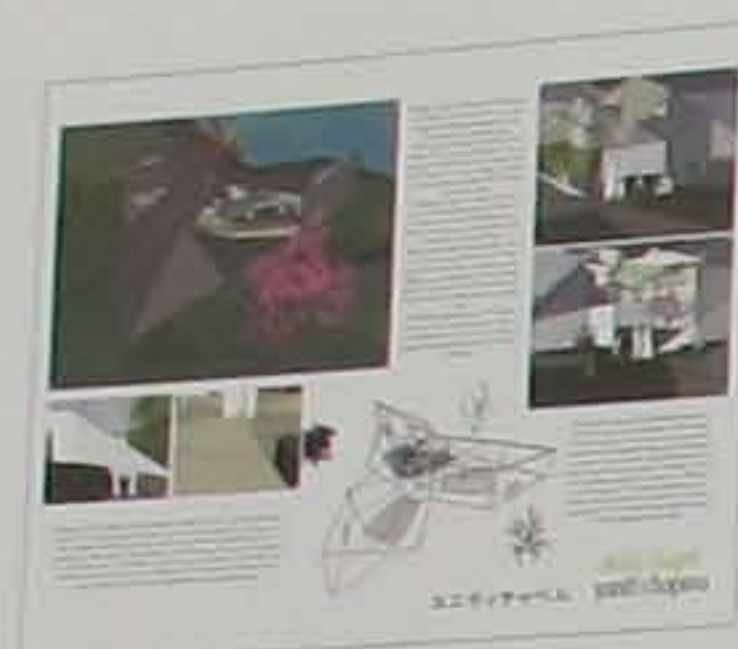
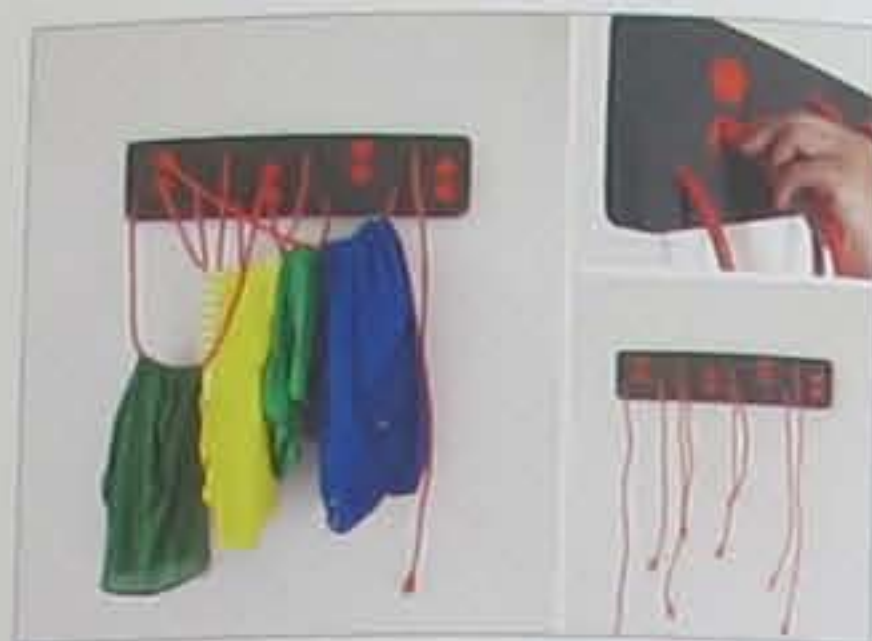




Adel Giumi
